

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Like many of us raised on 10 Things I Hate About You, The Taming of the Shrew has always had a nostalgic pull for me. But revisiting the original play as an adult is a different story—it's a piece that both fascinates and challenges, especially with its glaring patriarchal values and its controversial treatment of women. What I love about NOVA Nightsky Theater is our willingness to tackle these kinds of works head-on, not by sanitizing them, but by reframing them in ways that spark conversation.

Two things struck me as I returned to the text. First, the play is obsessed with performance—roleplaying, disguise, and the slippery nature of identity. Everyone in Shrew is pretending to be something they're not, whether for love, power, or survival. Second, and perhaps more provocatively, Katherine isn't really a shrew at all. She's sharp-tongued and unapologetically direct, yes—but not violent, monstrous, or unreasonable. It's the world around her that labels and punishes her for refusing to play nice.

That got me thinking: where in our modern world is performance not just encouraged but demanded? Where is being opinionated a liability, and authenticity constantly questioned? The answer came quickly—reality television.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE CONT.

In our adaptation, Bianca is a full-blown influencer and the star of her family's reality show, *Keeping Up with the Minolas*, managed by her ever-present mom-ager, Baptista. Katherine, meanwhile, wants none of it. Jaded by the spotlight and exhausted by the fakery, she just wants to run her family's SoCal vineyard, yearning for something real. Enter Petruchio—a fame-hungry wildcard looking to boost ratings and win Katherine's hand through an unconventional courtship in front of the cameras. What follows is a satire that explores love, power, identity, and the pressure to perform in a world built on appearances.

Ironically, most of us on the creative team aren't avid reality T.V. fans. But we had a blast building this hyper-curated world and populating it with larger-than-life characters. As Danielle J. Lindemann writes in True Story: What Reality TV Says About Us, the genre "is a fun-house mirror, to be sure, but one that powerfully reflects the contours of our social world."

We hope you enjoy our take on The Taming of the Shrew—a story about how hard it is to be real in a world that thrives on the fake.
